The largest member- and visitor-supported nature preserve in New York State, the Mohonk Preserve is located near New Paltz, New York – just two hours north of New York City and 15 minutes from the New York State Thruway.



Protecting over 6,500 acres of the Shawangunk Mountains, the Mohonk Preserve offers graduate-level internships for students during either the summer or the academic year. Students can affiliate with either the Preserve's Research or Land Stewardship Departments, or they can design an interdepartmental project linking both areas. On-site housing is available.

Research staff document and explain long-term environmental change on the ridge. Approved **Sussman interns can conduct research projects** in priority areas such as climate change, rare species, deer ecology, and cultural/landscape history, among others.

Preserve Stewardship staff work closely with Research to implement our Land Management Plan. Approved **Sussman interns can conduct land management projects** in areas such as fire management, old fields and cliff/talus monitoring, and visitor impact assessment, among others.
