- With support from the Loewy Family Foundation, initiated a project to establish long-term monitoring plots of forest vegetation and regeneration. Research is focused on areas with hemlock trees, which are being devastated by the Hemlock Wooly Adelgid, and ash trees at risk from infection by the Emerald Ash Borer.
- Celebrated the 25th Anniversary of our Schaefer Research Internship with a reunion hike, lunch, and reception.

- A new bike repair station was installed near the Trapps Bridge for bikers who need to make adjustments or repairs while at the Preserve.
- With partner Open Space Institute, work began along the Mohonk Preserve Foothills Loop of the River-to-Ridge Trail.
- 65 ranger responses: 23 climbing responses (including technical rescues), 21 responses to provide first aid on the land, and 21 responses including lost hikers and injured pets.




- Awarded 18 grants totalling \$616,558 to support Mohonk Preserve's mission and programs.

- 12 new libraries added to our Library Lending Program; the program now totals 26 libraries where people can obtain a free access pass to visit the Preserve.


